Answer any FOUR questions:

Question 1: The General Assembly of the United Nations Organisation played an important part in pressurising the government of South Africa to allow Namibians to decide their own destiny. Discuss some of the General Assembly resolutions, which were adopted between 1967 and 1968 calling on South Africa to withdraw from Namibia. (25)

Question 2: In 1948 the National Party won the general elections in South Africa and introduced Apartheid in South Africa and later in Namibia. Discuss the policy of Apartheid and explain some laws that were enacted by the Apartheid government to maintain White supremacy in Namibia. (25)

Question 3: In the 1940s the Herero Chiefs Council appointed Reverend Michael Scott as their representative to the United Nations. Explain how Rev. Scott became involved in the work of the Herero Chiefs Council and discuss the content of the petitions he presented to the UN in his role as the first petitioner. (25)

Question 4: Although women joined politics late as compared to their male counterparts the significance of their contribution to the liberation struggle of Namibia cannot be under rated. Outline the role of women in Namibia's liberation struggle and discuss the challenges they faced and the consequences of their political involvement in the struggle. (25)

Question 5: In 1946 South Africa sought consent of the United Nations Organization to incorporate South West Africa as its fifth province. Discuss Jan Smuts' justification for the incorporation of South West Africa to the Union of South and the response of the United Nations to South Africa's request. (25)

Question 6: In the 1960s apartheid South Africa's land policy in Namibia witnessed a transition from Native Reserves to Homelands. Discuss the role of the Odendaal Commission in the creation of Homelands. (25)
